Because of this variety, students from different academic backgrounds (10th, 12th, ITI, diploma holders) have entry paths via different "Centers" (CoST, CoVETS, etc.).

There is also a School of Research & Development in Skilling, meaning research and innovation are part of the mission.

The curriculum and certifications are designed in collaboration with industry leaders, which gives global relevance. There is a "School of International Qualifications" — students can earn internationally valid certifications.

According to news, LTSU has options like skill educational loans; for example, through some financial companies to support students financially.

The university emphasizes that fees should not become a barrier for meritorious but financially modest students.

### **4 Course Curriculum**

Some students have recommended updating the curriculum to make it more industry-relevant and Al-focused.

Administrative Delays There have been reports of slow processing of documents and administrative issues

Limited Sports and Cultural Events
The university has conducted fewer sports events and more technical functions, which may not cater to diverse student interests. However with a separate of new school of sports, we are in the process to overcome this weakness.

#### 5 Location

The university's location, outside the city, may be inconvenient for some students but the facility of Transport has helped students and employees to reach in time to the campus.

6 Under Utilization of Land: LTSU has huge chunk of land spread over 100 acres in the most eco-friendly environment but so far, whole of the land has not been put into use for want of capital expenditure. Only 25% of the total area is buildup. The University is only two years old and is self-financing, it is obvious that it will take some time for generating resources and give a shape that has been envisaged in the planned document of the University.

**7Shortage for National/International Work Force**: The University continues to actively seek highly qualified professionals in the domain of Future Skills, both at the national and international levels. However, despite sustained efforts, the available talent pool has not yet met the expectations of the University and its anchor partners.

- B Synchronization with SME from Industry: The university is heavily dependent upon Subject Matter Expert (SME) from industry partners. Due to their diverse timings, University has to compromise with the time table and timings of the classes.
- 9 Growing Stage of Research and Publications

As the University primarily focuses on and vocational education. skilling research and publication activities are currently in a developmental phase. While practical and industry-aligned training has been prioritized, the emphasis on academic research and scholarly output has not yet received the level of attention or resources required for significant growth. Strengthening research culture, faculty engagement in scholarly work, and infrastructure to support publications are areas that need strategic development to align with the evolving goals of higher education excellence

**No.25-Leg./2021.-** The following Act of the Legislature of the State of Punjab received the assent of the Governor of Punjab on the 2nd day of December, 2021, is hereby published for general information:-

### THE LAMRIN TECH SKILLS UNIVERSITY, PUNJAB ACT, 2021 (Punjab Act No. 22 of 2021)

AN

**ACT** 

to establish and incorporate a University in the State of Punjab to be known as the Lamrin Tech Skills University, Punjab for the purposes of making provisions for imparting instructions, teaching, education, research, training and related activities at all levels in the discipline of higher education including specifically designed skill intensive programmes in engineering, management, medical technology skills, hospitality, tourism, finance, accounting, healthcare, wellness, agriculture technology and management, entrepreneurship, vocational education and other programmes required from time to time to fulfil industry demand and other skill based programmes in collaboration with industry and foreign universities as permissible under the concerned regulatory authority and to provide for the matters connected therewith and/or incidental thereto;

Whereas the Rayat Educational and Research Trust, registered under the provisions of the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (Central Act XXI of 1860), made a proposal to the State Government for setting up a self-financing University in the State of Punjab on the basis of the Punjab Private Universities Policy, 2010, to make provisions for all the streams of higher education at all levels;

Whereas the State Government, after due consideration of the said proposal of the aforesaid Trust has come to the conclusion that the aforesaid Trust is capable of establishing and running the University and accordingly has accepted its proposal for the establishment of the said private University;

AND whereas in the circumstances referred to above, it is deemed expedient to establish the Lamrin Tech Skills University, Punjab for the aforesaid purposes.

BE it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Punjab in the Seventy-second Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

### Short title and commencement.

- 1. (1) This Act may be called the Lamrin Tech Skills University, Punjab Act. 2021.
- (2) It shall come into force on and with effect from the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.

#### Definitions.

- 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, -
  - (a) 'Academic Council' means the Academic Council of the University;
  - (b) 'authorities' means the authorities of the University;
  - (c) 'Board of Management' means the Board of Management of the University;
  - (d) 'Board of Studies' means a body to be constituted by the Governing Body;
  - (e) 'campuses' means a contiguous area within which the University is situated;
  - (f) 'Chancellor' means the Chancellor of the University;
  - (g) 'Chairman' means the Chairman of the Trust;
  - (h) 'Chief Finance and Accounts Officer' means the Chief Finance and Accounts Officer of the University;
  - (i) 'Dean' means the Dean of the University;
  - (j) 'Finance Committee' means the Finance Committee of the University;
  - (k) 'Governing Body' means the Governing Body of the University;
  - (l) 'institution' means any institution or college or academic centre (by whatever name it may be called) established, run, managed, recognized or constituted by the University, within the campus;
  - (m) 'prescribed' means prescribed by the statutes, ordinances and regulations;

- 'Registrar' means the Registrar of the University; (n)
- 'State Government' means the Government of the State of Punjab; (o)

- 'teacher' includes Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant (q) Professor, and any such other person, who imparts instruction in the University or in any of its institutions and centres;
- 'Trust' means the Rayat Educational and Research Trust registered (r) under the provisions of the Societies Registration Act, XXI of 1860;
- (s) 'University' means the Lamrin Tech Skills University, Punjab established under section 3 of this Act;
- 'Vice-Chancellor' means the Vice-Chancellor of the University; (t) and
- 'Visitor' means the Visitor of the University.
- (1) There shall be established a private University by the name of the Establishment Lamrin Tech Skills University, Punjab in the State of Punjab.

- (2) The University shall be run and managed by the Trust in accordance with the provisions of this Act.
- The University shall be a body corporate by the name mentioned in sub-section (1) and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal. It shall have the power to acquire, lease, hold, mortgage and dispose of property, both moveable and immovable and to make contracts, and shall sue and be sued by the said name.
- (4) The headquarter of the University shall be located at Railmajra, Balachaur, District Shaheed Bhagat Singh Nagar, Punjab – 144533.
- The University shall be self-financed and it shall not be entitled to receive any grant or other financial assistance from the State Government.
- The objects of the University shall be, -

to provide for instructions, teaching, education, research and training at all levels in the discipline of higher education including specifically designed skill intensive programmes in engineering, management, medical technology skills, hospitality, tourism, finance, accounting, healthcare, wellness, agriculture technology and management, entrepreneurship, vocational education and other skill based programmes in collaboration with industry and foreign universities, as per the needs of the industry and the society in general, as may be deemed necessary by the University, as permissible under the State or Central law and with the approval of the concerned Regulatory Authority;

- (ii) to promote the academic aspirations of rural students;
- (iii) to undertake industry-oriented teaching, training and research extension programmes and to provide employable skills with a view to contribute to the development of the society;
- (iv) to provide for research, creation, advancement and dissemination of knowledge, wisdom and understanding;
- (v) to encourage and motivate leading industrial houses for setting up at the campus their respective corporate institutes for academiaindustry nexus;
- (vi) to disseminate knowledge so as to make it accessible to all strata of the society;
- (vii) to promote Punjabi studies, to provide for research in Punjabi language and literature and to undertake measures for the development of Punjabi language, literature and culture;
- (viii) to open study centers, campuses, centers within its jurisdiction in accordance with the prevailing regulations, with the approval of the State Government;
- (ix) to set up off-campus centres, off-shore campuses, study centres and zonal or regional centres as per the guidelines of the University Grants Commission or its equivalent Body so created by the Central Government, and with the approval of the State Government; and
- (x) to do all such things, as may be necessary or desirable in furtherance to the objects of the University.

Powers and functions of the University.

5. The University shall have the following powers and functions to be exercised and performed by it or through its officers and authorities, namely:-

- (i) to impart education and to provide for instructions in various branches of learning and to confer or grant, subject to such conditions as the University may determine, degrees, diplomas, certificates or other academic distinctions on the basis of examinations, evaluation or any other method of testing on persons and to withdraw any such degree, diploma, certificate or other academic distinctions for good and sufficient cause;
- (ii) to make provisions and adopt all measures, including adoption and updating of the curricula, in respect of starting courses of study, teaching, training, research, consultancy and granting recognition and affiliation relating to the courses through traditional as well as new innovative modes including online education modes;
- (iii) to organize and to undertake extra mural studies and extension services;
- (iv) to conduct examinations for granting or conferring Post Doctorate, Doctorate, Masters, Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates;
- (v) to provide for dual Degree, Diploma or Certificate vis-à-vis other Universities on reciprocal basis;
- (vi) to institute and confer honorary Degrees and other distinctions, as may be prescribed;
- (vii) to conduct e-learning and online education programmes, as may be determined by the University;
- (viii) to provide for equivalence of the degrees, diplomas and certificates of the students completing their courses partially or in full, from any other recognized University, Board or Council or any other competent authority;
- (ix) to institute and confer the designation of Professor, Associate Professor, Reader, Assistant Professor, Lecturer or any other equivalent designation, as may be required by the University in its campuses or its institutions and to appoint persons as such;
- (x) to create academic, administrative, ministerial, technical and other posts and to make appointments thereto;
- (xi) to appoint persons working in any other University or institutions or

- organizations having specific knowledge permanently or for a specified period;
- (xii) to co-operate, collaborate or associate with any other University or authority or institution in such manner and for such purpose as the University may determine;
- (xiii) to establish and maintain study centres, examination centres, information centres, schools, institutions, specialized laboratories or other units for research and instructions as may be determined by the University for furtherance of its objects within its campus;
- (xiv) to undertake research and consultancy and for that purpose to enter into such arrangements with other institutions or bodies as the University may deem necessary;
- (xv) to determine standards for admission into the University, which may include examination, evaluation or any other method of testing;
- (xvi) to prescribe the fee structure for various categories of students, in view of clause 8 of the Punjab Private Universities Policy, 2010:
- (xvii) to demand and collect fees and other charges, as may be prescribed;
- (xviii) to supervise the residences of the students of the University and to make arrangements for the promotion of their health and general welfare;
- (xix) to make special arrangements in respect of female students, as the University may consider necessary and desirable;
- (xx) to regulate and enforce discipline among the employees and students of the University and take such disciplinary measures in this regard, as may be deemed necessary by the University;
- (xxi) to make arrangements for promoting the health and general welfare of the employees of the University;
- (xxii) to receive donations; and acquire, hold, manage and dispose of any moveable or immovable property;

- (xxiii) to borrow money for the purposes of the University, with the approval of the Trust;
- (xxiv) to mortgage or hypothecate the property of the University with the approval of the Trust;
- (xxv) to hold, manage and run the funds of the Trust and the endowments created in favour of the University;
- (xxvi) to receive and to raise loans and advances for the University;
- (xxvii) to purchase, acquire and take on lease or mortgage any immovable or movable property and to sell, lease, mortgage, alienate and transfer any immovable or movable property belonging to or vested in the University;
- (xxviii) to receive grants from the University Grants Commission and other Central or State agencies;
- (xxix) to fix, determine and provide salaries, remunerations and honoraria to teachers and employees of the University in accordance with the norms specified by the University Grants Commission;
- (xxx)to do self-certification, which shall be exempted from obtaining any permission, approval, license, certificate, No Objection Certificate or authorization from the State Government or any other body, set up by the State Government;
- (xxxi) to frame statutes, ordinances and regulations for carrying out the objects of the University; and
- (xxxii) to perform all such other functions, which may be necessary or desirable in furtherance of the objects of the University.
- The University shall exercise its jurisdiction within its campuses in Jurisdiction of 6. the State of Punjab only.

University.

- The University shall affiliate to it those educational or professional institutions, established, run or managed by the Trust within the Campus regard to which a specific decision is taken by the Trust.
- 7. The following shall be the officers of the University, namely: -

Officers of the University.

(i) the Visitor;

- (ii) the Chancellor;
- (iii) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (iv) the Registrar;
- (v) the Deans of the Faculties;
- (vi) the Chief Finance and Accounts Officer; and
- (vii) such other officers of the University, as may be declared by the statutes, to be the officers of the University.

The Visitor.

- 8. (1) The Governor of Punjab shall be the Visitor of the University.
- (2) The Visitor shall preside over the convocation of the University for conferring degrees and diplomas.
- (3) The Visitor shall have the right to call for any information relating to the affairs of the University.
- (4) The Visitor may cause the inspection, scrutiny, investigation, survey or inquiry or any other such like thing to be made by such person, as he may direct in respect of administrative, academic or executive matters of the University.
- (5) The Visitor shall, in every case, give notice to the University of his or her intention to cause the inspection, scrutiny, investigation, survey or inquiry or any other such like thing, to be made and the University shall appoint a representative, who shall be present at such inspection, scrutiny, investigation, survey or inquiry, or any other such like thing, as the case may be.
- (6) The Visitor may inform the Vice-Chancellor about the results of such inspection, scrutiny, investigation, survey or inquiry and the Vice-Chancellor shall communicate to the Governing Body the views of the Visitor along with such advice, as the Visitor may have tendered and the action to be taken on such advice.
- (7) The Vice-Chancellor shall inform the Visitor about the action taken or proposed to be taken by the University with respect to the inspection, scrutiny, investigation, survey, inquiry, or any other such like thing, as the case may be.
- (8) If the State Government considers it appropriate, in public interest, to make inspection, scrutiny, investigation, survey or inquiry, as the case may be, in respect of any matter relating to the University or its institutions, a

reference shall be made by the State Government to the Vice-Chancellor, who shall cause such inspection, scrutiny, investigation, survey or inquiry to be made.

- 9. (1) The Chairman shall be the Chancellor of the University and in the The absence of the Visitor, the Chancellor shall preside over the convocation of Chancellor the University.
- (2) The Chancellor shall be the Chairman of the Governing Body and he or she shall approve all appointments, nominations, removals, suspensions and reinstatements of the employees and officers of the University on the recommendation of the Governing Body of the University.
- (3) The Chancellor may amend or revoke any decision taken by any authority or officer of the University and may exercise his powers, to do all necessary things to facilitate the smooth functioning of the University on the recommendation of the Governing Body.
- (4) The Chancellor shall have the power to perform all such other functions, as may be required to do in furtherance to the objects of the University and any matter incidental thereto and the decisions taken by the Chancellor shall be final and binding on all the concerned of the University.
- (5) If, in the opinion of the Chancellor, any decision of any officer or authority of the University is beyond the powers conferred under this Act or the statutes or the ordinances or the regulations or is likely to be prejudicial to the interests of the University, the Chancellor shall ask such officer or authority to revise his or its decision within a period of fifteen days and in case the officer or authority refuses to revise such decision, wholly or partly, or fails to take any decision within a period of fifteen days, the decision of the Chancellor thereon shall be final.
- (6) If, at any time, upon the representation made or otherwise, it appears to the Chancellor that the Vice-Chancellor or any other officer of the University,-
  - (a) has made default in performing any duty imposed upon him under this Act or otherwise; or
  - (b) has acted in a manner prejudicial to the interests of the University; or

(c) is incapable of managing the affairs of the University, the Chancellor may, notwithstanding the fact that term of that officer has not expired by an order in writing and stating the reasons therein, require the Vice-Chancellor or the officer concerned to relinquish his or her office from such date, as may be specified in the order. The Vice-Chancellor or the officer concerned shall be deemed to have relinquished his office from the date so specified:

Provided that no such order shall be passed, unless the grounds on which such action is proposed to be taken are communicated to the Vice-Chancellor or to the officer concerned and he or she is given reasonable opportunity of being heard.

The Vice-Chancellor.

- 10. (1) The Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Chancellor from amongst the panel of three persons recommended by the Governing Body.
- (2) No person shall be appointed as Vice-Chancellor, unless he or she possesses such qualifications, as are specified by the University Grants Commission or its equivalent body so created by the Central Government.
- (3) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the overall in-charge of the University who shall exercise general superintendence and control in the affairs of the University and shall execute the decisions of various authorities of the University.
- (4) In case of the absence of the Visitor and the Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor shall preside over the convocation of the University.
- (5) The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.

The Registrar.

- 11. (1) The Registrar shall be appointed by the Chancellor from amongst the panel of three persons recommended by the Governing Body.
- (2) No person shall be appointed as Registrar, unless he or she possesses such qualifications as are specified by the University Grants Commission, or its equivalent body so created by the Central Government.
- (3) The Registrar shall sign all contracts and authenticate all documents or records for and on behalf of the University.
- (4) The Registrar shall be the Member-Secretary of the Governing Body, the Board of Management and the Academic Council but he or she shall not have the right to vote.

(1) The Chief Accounts and Finance Officer shall get the annual budget of the University prepared along with the requisite documents and submit the same to the Finance Committee for its approval. The Chief Accounts and Finance Officer shall also get the accounts of the annual income and expenditure of the University prepared and shall get the same audited from the Chartered Accountant so appointed by the Finance Committee in this regard.
- (2) The budget approved by the Finance Committee along with the note with regard to the audit of income and expenditure of the University, referred to in sub-section (1), shall be placed before the Chancellor for its approval.
- (3) The Finance Committee shall tender advice to the Chancellor on financial matters of the University.

Other authorities.

20. The composition, constitution, powers and functions of authorities under clause (v) of section 14, shall be such, as may be prescribed.

Disqualification for membership of an authority or body.

- 21. A person shall be disqualified for being a member of any of the authorities or bodies of the University, if he, -
  - (i) is of unsound mind and stands so declared by a competent court; or
  - (ii) is an un-discharged insolvent; or
  - (iii) has been convicted of any offence involving moral turpitude; or
  - (iv) has been punished for indulging in or promoting unfair practice in the conduct of any examination in any form and anywhere.

Acts or proceedings not to be invalidated due to vacancies.

- 22. No act done, or proceedings taken, under this Act by any authority or other body of the University shall be invalid merely on the ground of, -
  - (a) any vacancy or defect in the constitution of the authority or body; or
  - (b) any defect or irregularity in nomination or appointment of a person acting as member thereof; or
  - (c) any defect or irregularity in such act or proceeding not affecting the merits of the case.

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23. If any vacancy occurs in any authority or body of the University due to Filling up of death, resignation or removal of a member or due to change of capacity in emergent. which he or she was appointed or nominated, the same shall be filled in as early as possible by the authority or body, which had appointed or nominated such a member:

  - (iv) the manner, terms and conditions of appointment of other officers and teachers and their powers and functions;
  - (v) the terms and conditions of service of the employees of the University;
  - (vi) the procedure for arbitration in case of dispute between the University, officers, teachers, employees and students;

- (vii) the conferment of honorary degrees;
- (viii) the exemption of students from payment of tuition fee and for awarding them scholarships and fellowships;
- (ix) the policy of admissions, including regulation of reservation of seats, keeping in view of clause 9 of the Punjab Private Universities Policy, 2010;
- (x) the number of seats in different courses; and
- (xi) all other matters for which statutes are required to be made under this Act.
- (4) After the approval of the Chancellor, the statutes of the University shall be submitted to the State Government for its approval.
- (5) The State Government shall consider the statutes submitted by the University and shall give its approval without or with such modifications, if any, as it may deem necessary and return the statutes to the University.
- (6) The University shall, with the approval of the Governing Body, communicate its concurrence to the statutes as approved by the State Government, and if it desires not to give effect to any or all of the modifications made by the State Government, it may give reasons thereof.
- (7) After the statutes are finally approved by the State Government, these shall be published in the Official Gazette of the University.
- (8) The statutes so made, shall not be amended without the approval of the State Government.

Power to make ordinances.

- 26. (1) The Governing Body may, from time to time, make ordinances or may amend, or repeal the same.
- (2) Every ordinance or any amendment made therein or repeal thereof, shall require the approval of the Chancellor.
- (3) Subject to the provisions of this Act and the statutes, the ordinances may provide for the following matters, namely: -
  - (i) the admission of students to the University and their enrolment as such;
  - (ii) the courses of study to be laid down for the degrees, diplomas and certificates of the University;

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- (iii) the degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions;
- (iv) the fees to be charged for various courses, examinations, degrees and diplomas of the University;
- (v) the conditions for the award of fellowships, scholarships, studentships, medals and prizes;
- (vi) the conduct of examinations, including the terms of office, the manner of appointment and the duties of the examining bodies, examiners and moderators;
- (vii) the conditions of hostel facilities for students in the University;
- (viii) taking disciplinary action against the students of the University;
- (ix) the creation, composition and function of any other body, which is considered necessary for improving the academic standard of the University;
- (x) the manner of co-operation and collaboration with other Universities and institutions; and
- (xi) all other matters which by this Act or the statutes made thereunder are required to be provided by the ordinances.
- (4) After the approval of the Chancellor, the ordinances of the University shall be submitted to the State Government for its approval.
- (5) The State Government shall consider the ordinances submitted by the University and shall give its approval without or with such modifications, if any, as it may deem necessary and return the same to the University.
- (6) The University shall, with the approval of the Governing Body, communicate its concurrence to the ordinances as approved by the State Government and if it desires not to give effect to any or all of the modifications made by the State Government, it may give reasons thereof.
- (7) After the ordinances are finally approved by the State Government, these shall be published in the Official Gazette of the University.
- (8) The ordinances so made, shall not be amended without the approval of the State Government.

Power to make regulations.

- 27. (1) The Governing Body may, from time to time, make regulations or may amend, or repeal the same.
- (2) Every regulation or any amendment made therein or repeal thereof, shall require the approval of the Chancellor.
- (3) After the approval of the Chancellor, the regulations of the University shall be submitted to the State Government for its approval.
- (4) The State Government shall consider the regulations submitted by the University and shall give its approval without or with such modifications, if any, as it may deem necessary and forward the same to the University.
- (5) The University shall, with the approval of the Governing Body, communicate its concurrence to the regulations as approved by the State Government and if it desires not to give effect to any or all of the modifications made by the State Government, it may give reasons thereof.
- (6) After the regulations are finally approved by the State Government, these shall be published in the Official Gazette of the University.
- (7) The regulations so made, shall not be amended without the approval of the State Government.

University to follow rules, regulations etc. of the regulating bodies.

- 28. (1) The University shall be prohibited from conferring any Degrees, not recognized by the University Grants Commission or its equivalent body constituted by the Central Government.
- (2) It shall be mandatory for the University to follow the University Grants Commission (Establishment and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003, or any other regulations made for private Universities by the University Grants Commission or any other regulatory bodies.

General Fund.

- 29. (1) The University shall have General Fund to which shall be credited,-
  - (a) fees and other charges received by the University;
  - (b) any income received from consultancy and other work undertaken by the University; and
  - (c) funds and grants received from any source by the University for research projects from any Government and non-Government funding agencies.

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- (2) The General Fund shall be utilized for the following purposes, namely: -
  - (a) for the repayment of the debts, including interest charges thereto incurred by the University;
  - (b) for the upkeep of the assets of the University;
  - (c) for the payment of the cost of audit of the fund;
  - (d) for meeting the expenses of any suit or proceedings;
  - (e) for the payment of salaries and allowances of the officers and employees of the University and for the payment of any benefit to any such officer and employee;
  - (f) for the payment of travelling and other allowances of the members of the authorities, committee or Board of the University;
  - (g) for the payment of fellowships, scholarships, assistanceships and other awards to students belonging to economically weaker sections of the society or research associates or trainees, as the case may be, or to any student eligible for such awards;
  - (h) for the payment of any expenses incurred by the University;
  - (i) for acquisition of land or any kind of development work or likewise activities for the purpose of the University;
  - (j) for the payment of cost of capital and repayment of loans incurred by the Trust for setting up and running the University and the investments made therefore;
  - (k) for the payment of charges and expenditure relating to the consultancy work undertaken by the University; and
  - (l) for the payment of any expenditure, salaries, taxes, liabilities by the Trust for or on behalf of the University.
- 30. The accounts of the income and expenditure of the University shall be Annual report. audited by the Chartered Accountant of the University, and the same shall be submitted once in a year by the Chief Finance and Accounts Officer to the Governing Body for its approval.
- 31. The University shall prepare and publish a semester-wise or annual, as Examinations. the case may be, tentative Schedule of Examinations including various academic

activities to be conducted by the University in the beginning of each academic session, but not later than the 30th August in a Calendar year.

Explanation.- 'Schedule of Examinations' means the time table giving details about the time, day and date of the commencement of each paper which is part of the scheme of examinations including the details of practical examinations and viva –voce, if any.

#### Declaration of results.

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- 32. (1) The University shall strive to declare the results of examinations conducted by it within a period of forty-five days from the last date of the examination of particular course but, in any case, not later than sixty days from the said date.
- (2) No examination or the result of an examination shall be held invalid only for the reason that the University has not followed the Schedule of Examinations.

#### Convocation.

33. The convocation of the University shall be held in every academic year for conferring degrees, diplomas, certificates or any other academic distinction or for any other purpose, in such manner, as may be prescribed.

# Disputes concerning authorities and bodies.

34. If any question arises with respect to the appointment or entitlement of any person, to be a member of any authority or other body of the University, the same shall be referred to the Chancellor, whose decision thereon shall be final and binding.

## Power to remove difficulties.

35. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to any of the provisions of this Act, the State Government may, in consultation with the Chancellor, by an order published in the Official Gazette, make such provision, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as it may deem necessary for removing such difficulty:

Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of a period of two years from the date of commencement of this Act.

## Protection of action taken in good faith.

36. No suit or other legal proceedings shall lie against any officer or employee of the University for anything which is done in good faith or intended to be done in pursuance of the provisions of this Act, the statutes, the ordinances or the regulations.

#### Transitory Provisions.

37. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the statutes, the ordinances or the regulations made thereunder, the Trust may, subject to the

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availability of the funds, discharge all or any of the functions of the University for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act, the statutes, the ordinances and the regulations and for that purpose, may exercise such powers and perform such duties, which by this Act or by such statutes, the ordinances and the regulations are to be exercised or performed by any authority or officer of the University, until such authority comes into existence or officer is appointed.

- 38. (1) The Lamrin Tech Skills University Ordinance, 2021 (Punjab Repeal and Ordinance No. 3 of 2021), is hereby repealed.
- (2) Notwithstanding such repeal, anything done or any action taken under the Ordinance referred to in sub-section (1), shall be deemed to have been done or taken under this Ordinance.

#### I. Opening Remarks by Hon'ble Chancellor Dr. Sandeep Singh Kaura.

The Hon'ble Chancellor Dr. Sandeep Singh Kaura in his opening remarks reiteratedhis commitment to pursue the vision and mission of Lamrin Tech Skills University. **Continuous Assessment and Theory Examination** 

#### **Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation**

As envisioned in the National Educational Policy, 2020 the system of evaluation and assessment at LTSU shall be based on continuous and comprehensive evaluation rather than high-stake examination.

- (i) To make this system fairer and comparable, the University has adopted criterion-based grading system that assesses achievement of a learner based on learning goals for each course/programme.
- (ii) There shall be proper mapping between the system of evaluation and assessment and programme outcomes, whereby, the skills, knowledge and abilities of learner is assessed at each successive level of programme.

- (iii) Since, assessment drives learning, the question papers are designed to assess higher-order abilities and skills in addition to knowledge by applying Bloom's Taxonomy Framework. These are well balanced to test the different cognitive skills based on successive levels.
- (iv) Care shall be taken to stimulate critical thinking and to enthuse problem solving ability among the students. The design of these activities must be aligned to competencies identified as per level-based requirements.
- (v) The students shall be assessed for the presentation of the project work by an expert other than the teacher who is teaching the subject on the basis of defined assessment criteria as rubrics.

#### Structure of Continuous Evaluation and Weightage

The structure of Continuous Evaluation shall be as under:

#### **Mid Semester Tests (Theory)**

- (i) As parts of continuous and comprehensive evaluation and assessment process, two Mid Semester Tests shall be conducted during a semester.
- (ii) These tests shall cover the syllabi covered till the prescribed schedule which will be notified to the students at commencement of the Semester.
- (iii) The question papers must maintain a balance in terms of assessing knowledge, abilities and skills as per Bloom's Taxonomy Framework.
- (iv) Two sets of a question paper shall be set for each course by an expert/teacher from a panel of three experts within the university.
- (v) The question papers shall be opened by a nominee of Vice Chancellor / Registrar in presence of Controller of Examinations/Superintendent. Utmost secrecy shall be maintained in this process.
- (vi) LTSU adopts very transparent process of evaluation, the answer sheets of Mid Semester Tests evaluated assignment/project files are discussed before returning these back to students.
- (vii) Date sheet for the Mid Semester Tests will be communicated to the students at least 10 days before the conduct. The schedule for Mid Semester Tests and End Term shall be communicated in the Academic Calendar.
- (viii) There shall be provision of retest before the End Semester Exam for the slow learners with approval of Vice Chancellor.

Mid Semester Tests (Theory) is conducted for 25 marks with duration of one hour and thirty minutes. The question papers for Mid Semester Test are set as per following format:

#### **Examination Instructions**

- (i) It is the responsibility of the students to ensure they are aware of the correct time, date of all exams and examination centres.
- (ii) Only the members of examination team and students on production of ID shall be allowed in the examination center.
- (iii) The students are identified by their registration/roll number and these need to be written on the exam papers by the candidate. Candidates will not be permitted entry to the exam room without their Student ID Card and Examination Admit Card.
- (iv) The students can have allowed only half these need to be written on the exam papers by the candidate. Candidates will not be permitted entry
- (v) The areas used for conduct of examinations and evaluation of answer sheets will remain under CCTV surveillance round the clock.

#### Attendance

- (i) A student is expected to have 100 per cent attendance
- (ii) To meet the shortage of attendance due to reasons beyond the control of a student, relaxation of maximum 25 per cent may be given after permission of Dean/HOD.

- (iii) The student with less than 75 per cent attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End Semester Examination.
- (iv) Only under extreme circumstances The Vice-Chancellor may condone up to 5 per cent attendance shortage below 75 per cent on recommendation of Dean/HOD. In such case the student shall be awarded with appropriate letter grade not exceeding B+.
- (v) The percentage of attendance shall be calculated up to the last day of class and forwarded to Examination Department for issue of Admit Card.
- (vi) A notice will be sent to the student and parents in case of continuous absence for one week. A copy of the notice be also sent to Registrar.
- (vii) If a student is absent continuously for 30 days without permission, his name shall be struck off. Such a student may apply re-admission as per rules.
- (i) The examination fee shall not be refunded if examination form is rejected on account of producing fraudulent documents, debarment or detention due to shortage of lecture.

#### **Evaluation Grades**

All assessment of course/programme will be done on absolute marks basis. The internal marks awarded to the student are combined with the marks of their end semester examination. UGC recommends 10 points grading system for higher education and the same is applicable at LTSU; the letter grades and grade points are awarded for the marks in line with UGC as indicated below:

#### **Guidelines to Conduct Practical Examination under Continuous Evaluation System**

- (i) The Dean/Head of the Schools prepares a date and time schedule for practical examinations for each semester of all the Programs.
- (ii) The batch-wise schedule is based on University Roll Number of the Students.
- (iii) Duration of the practical is of three hours.
- (iv) Practical examination is be conducted in two shifts in a day.
- (v) The structure and nature of practical examinations maintains a balance in terms of assessing knowledge, abilities and skills as per Bloom's Taxonomy Framework. Care is taken to aligned it to assess the competencies identified as per course objectives.
- (vi) The learning outcomes is tested during practical examinations including:
  - a) Remembering (recalling from the memory of the previous learning material)
  - b) Understanding (explaining ideas or concepts)
  - c) Application skills (using the information in other familiar situation)
  - d) Analytical ability (Breaking information into parts to explore relationships)
  - e) Evaluative ability (justifying a decision or course of action)
  - f) Creative skills (generating new ideas, products or new ways of viewing things)
- (vii) The practical examination is conducted by one external examiner (appointed by the Vice-Chancellor through the Controller of Examinations on the recommendation of Dean/Head) and one internal examiner (appointed by the Dean/Head from amongst the faculty).
- (viii) The Appointment letter to the external examiners is issued by the Controller of Examinations.
- (ix) There are two internal examiners for a given batch. However, both the examiners can be external.
- (x) No practical examination is conducted in the absence of an external examiner. The examination is postponed in such cases, in consultation with the Controller of Examinations and the students are intimated accordingly.
- (xi) Dean/Head of respective School's is the Chief-Coordinator for the Practical Examinations.
- (xii) Other examination personnel includes the External Examiner, Internal Examiner and Lab Assistants.
- (xiii) The Internal Examiner is responsible to ensure the complete readiness of the lab for the respective practical examination.
- (xiv) No students is allowed for the examination without their prescribed Practical records certified by the Staff in-charge and certificate of attendance for at least 75 per cent attendance in practical sessions.
- (xv) Separate attendance record of students is maintained during the Practical Examinations.
- (xvi) All record including answer sheets are preserved for a Period of One Year.

#### **Continuous Internal Evaluation System**

As envisioned in the National Educational Policy, 2020 the system of evaluation and assessment at LTSU is based on continuous and comprehensive evaluation rather than high-stake examination. To make this system fairer and comparable, the university has adopted criterion- based grading system that assesses achievement of a learner on the basis of learning goals for each Course.

#### **EVALUATION SCHEME**

There is proper mapping between the system of evaluation and assessment and Program outcomes, whereby, the skills, knowledge and abilities of learner is assessed at each successive level of Programme. The question papers are designed to assess higher-order Abilities, Skills and knowledge by applying Bloom's Taxonomy Framework.

The components of evaluation during a semester along with their weightage followed by LTSU are as under:

The two Mid Semester Tests are conducted during a semester. These tests cover the prescribed syllabi which is notified to the students at commencement of the Semester.

Date sheet for the Sessional Tests is communicated to the students at least 10 days before the conduct of examinations. The schedule for Sessional Tests and End Term Exams is communicated in the Academic Calendar. There is provision of retest before the End Semester Exam for the slow learners with approval of V.C./ Registrar.

Two sets of a question paper of MST is set for each course by the teacher from within the University. Utmost secrecy will be maintained in this process. LTSU adopts very transparent process of evaluation. The evaluated answer sheets of Sessional Tests, assignment/project, are discussed with the students.

The LTSU has adopted separation of educator and evaluator in the process of internal evaluation particularly in terms of presentations. A student is assessed for the presentation of the project work by an expert other than the teacher who is teaching the course.

End Semester Exams for each course/paper covers the whole syllabus for one semester carrying uniform distribution of contents. The student must attain 40% marks for Theory Paper and 50% marks for Practical Papers to clear a particular course. At the end of each semester, the student is issued Grade Card indicating the grades secured.

No student will be eligible to appear in End Term Exams if he/she does not meet the condition of minimum 75 % attendance in all Theory and Practical Classes with minimum marks in Sessional Tests. The COE will not issue the Admit Card in case of any default.

The detailed information regarding rules and regulations for examinations is communicated to students beforehand.

Two sets of Question Papers for End Term Examination are framed for each course by an Expert / Teacher from a panel of three experts outside the University with minimum three years of experience.

The question papers in the End Semester Exams are well balanced, consisting of various difficulty levels to accommodate different capabilities of students. The nature of questions is balanced in terms of assessing knowledge, abilities and skills as per Bloom's Framework.

The question papers are opened by Centre Superintendent in the presence of Controller of Examinations / nominee of COE. Utmost secrecy will be maintained in this process.

Evaluation of answer sheets of End Semester Examinations are carried out under the supervision of Controller of Examinations and Examination Team in a central evaluation center. Coding and Decoding of answer sheets is adopted to maintain confidentiality and objectivity in evaluation process. The answer sheets have defined number of pages. The COE adopts the principle of quick collection and sealing of answer sheets which are kept in the strong room with restricted entry. The areas used for conduct of examinations is under CCTV surveillance.





### **NRI** and **Overseas Policy**

The objectives of the admission policy of the University with regard to NRI and Overseas students is:

- 1. To facilitate a smooth and simple admission of international students in Lamrin Tech Skills University.
- 2. To create a favourable environment for attracting international students to Indian higher education system in the University.
- 3. To make India in general and LTSU in particular, a preferred destination for international students.
- Internationalisation of higher education is the process of integrating an international and intercultural dimension in higher education. The University shall provide opportunities to international students for admission to them in the various courses/ programmes in all the schools and study centres of the University as per guidelines of University Grants Commission. International students in this context shall be defined as the one who shall possess a foreign passport.
- The University shall admit international students based on the equivalence of entry qualification held by them. The equivalence is to be determined by the University Grants Commission (UGC) or any other body recognised by UGC for such purpose or the concerned regulatory bodies of the country.
- The University shall create 25% supernumerary seats for international students, over and above of University's total sanctioned enrolment for Certification, Diploma, Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes.
- The 25% of the supernumerary seats for international students will not include the international students under exchange programmes or /and through Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the university or between Government of India and other countries.
- The University shall distribute all 25% seats to all departments and Schools as per availability of infrastructure and qualified faculty.
- If a seat remains unfilled in the supernumerary category, it shall be allocated to anyone other than an international student as per the rules and regulations of the University prescribed from time to time.
- Supernumerary seats for Ph.D. programmes shall be governed by the Regulations notified by the University Grants Commission from time to time in this regard.
- The provision of creating supernumerary seats for international students should be formalized by way of approval of statutory body/bodies of the University in accordance with the guidelines/regulations issued by the regulatory bodies from

- The University has an 'Office for International Students'. In this office Year-wise
  details, i.e., country, number, programme/subject, duration etc., regarding the
  international students in the University shall be maintained and the same shall be
  made available on official website.
- The students should share the scan copy of Academic transcripts to check the eligibility for the admission in the programme of the university.
- The evaluation of copy of the academic transcripts is done with the bench mark process As laid down as per the provision of equivalence for foreign degrees.
- An offer letter is issued to the students with all the details of the program, fee structure and prospectus. After the payment of provisional admission fee by the students in the university Account, an acceptance letter is issued to the students for final confirmation of admission.
- The students can use this admission letter, original academic transcripts and certificates to apply for study visa in the nearby Indian Embassy. The original documents of the students will be verified at the reporting time.
- The Registration of international students admitted will be enrolled in Foreign Regional Registration Office (FRRO) by the university within fortnight of their arrival in University.

The final verification of the original certificates and academic transcript will be done by the respective School/Department in the University. The students will be then admitted as per the admission policy of the University.

#### I. Opening Remarks by Hon'ble Chancellor Dr. Sandeep Singh Kaura.

The Hon'ble Chancellor Dr. Sandeep Singh Kaura in his opening remarks reiteratedhis commitment to pursue the vision and mission of Lamrin Tech Skills University. Hon'ble Chancellor's Words	Dr. Sandeep Singh Kaura, Hon'ble Chancellor of LTSU, welcomed all the members of the Board of Governors and extended a special thanks to Prof. (Dr.) Rajeev Ahuja for his first visit to the LTSU campus. Dr. Kaura introduced Dr. M.B. Gururaj Vice- President, Business Development & Innovation and Dr. Anita Abbi, Pro Vice Chancellor for Government Projects, who were attending the meeting for the first time.  Following this, Dr. Kaura shared the mission of LTSU — to deliver quality education to the masses — and highlighted the university's rapid growth in a short span of time. He further stated that LTSU has developed sufficient infrastructure and remains committed to enhancing it every year to support the development of its students.
Confirmation of the minutes of meeting held on 12th January, 2024.	Dr. Ashutosh Sharma, Executive Dean of USCM, presented the progress report of LTSU for the year 2024–25. He covered all the major events and achievements of the university during the year. Dr. Sharma also provided an overview of the existing schools and the total number of academic programs being offered across various domains. In addition, he shared the total number of students enrolled in different programs, both on-campus and off-campus.  The members confirmed the minutes of the meeting held on 12 <sup>th</sup> January, 2024.
Industry Collaborated Technical Programs	LTSU Punjab put forth that seeing the success of existing programs many industries have offered to collaborate and start various B.Tech programs on new age technologies in USET, LTSU Punjab. The details of the collaborating industry partners and about the program Objective, Program name, specialisation to be offered, eligibility criteria, admission process, establishment of Centre of Excellence (COE) at LTSU by the industry and Technology Centre of Excellence

at industry by the industry, internships and Letter of Intent (LOI) and industry's corporate partners were discussed. The collaborating industries are:

- QSpider, a world-leading software training company based in Bangaluru.
- Intellipaat, a Bangaluru based global online professional training provider.
- Amphiventures, headquartered in Coimbatore, a next-generation global eduTech company.

The objective and importance of these programs which are designed with a goal of real life industry exposure for the student.

- Develop and deliver industry-oriented skill programs, align curriculum with cutting-edge automation technologies and global IT demands.
- Integrate academic content with real-world industrial exposure
- Train future-ready engineers equipped with global-standard technical and soft skills.
- Ensure graduates are productive from day one and ready for AI-driven careers.
- Enhance student employability through internships, hand on learning and industry-led curriculum.

In addition, the industry is going to establish Centre of Excellence in university campus and a dedicated Technology Centre of Excellence in industry. A Letter of Intent (LOI) to students upon confirmation of admission will also be given by the QSpider and Amphiventures.

It was further informed that the proposal to start the programs were put forward in the Board of Studies (BoS) and after detailed discussions and deliberations the program details were worked out and further seeing the diversification in delivery mechanism proposed by industry, an expert committee was constituted to seek their option. The recommendation of the expert committee was also discussed in length with the members present.

The members unanimously approved:

#### A. The Proposed Courses with Specializations.

- 1. M.Tech in Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) *Duration: 2 Years*
- 2. B.Tech in Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) *Duration: 4 Years*
- 3. Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) *Duration: 3 Years* 
  - Specialization in all above: 1. Automation 2. Robotic Process Automation (RPA)
- 4. B.Tech in Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) Duration: 4 Years

  Specialization: Full Stack Development with AI

5. B.Tech in Computer Science and Technology(CST)

Duration: 4 Years

Specialization: AI with System Design

#### B. Academic delivery framework:

- 1. The delivery of course content in case of Amphiventure is approved, 80%-20% by industry experts/SMEs and University respectively, as it is done with in the university premises, so no capping on the portion of course content delivery by industry or LTSU.
- 2. Program offered in collaboration with QSpiders and Intellipaat:

It was approved that being skill university and more emphasis should be on enhancing student's skills, so it is decided that upto 55% of credits should be covered under technical skills and upto 15% skills covering ability enhancement, value added courses, etc., totalling of upto 70%, can be covered under skilling and a balance of upto 30% focusing the core courses. With the establishment of Centre of Excellence by the industry in LTSU initial phase of course to be imparted at LTSU and remaining part at the Technology Centre of Excellence established in industry.

3. The members positively acknowledged the Letter of Intent (LOI) and internship initiative as a step toward ensuring employment assurance for students.

The members recommended that the information of the industry led programs should be shared with UGC/AICTE.

## Program in Collaboration of Railtel Corporation of India and NSDC

Dr. Dhami presented the further new initiatives of LTSU which are Diploma program in Engineering with collaboration of Railtel and NSDC. LTSU will offer the diploma courses in

- 1 Mechanical Engineering
- 2. Electrical Engineering
- 3. Electronics and Communication Engineering
- 4. Civil Engineering

After it, Hon'ble Chancellor apprised members that LTSU became the first university to start the Diploma and Certificate programs with Railway( Railtel)

All the members appreciated this proposal and approved the programs.

Dr. Rajeev Ahuja, Director of IIT Ropar, appreciated the initiative and suggested that LTSU should collaborate with Gati Shakti University to facilitate lateral entry admissions into Degree programs for students who completed Diploma courses from LTSU.

## BSc(Hons) in Accounting and Finance

LTSU proposed BSC (Hons) in Accounting and Finance at Lamrin Business Schools, with a global focus and specialization in US GAAP. It's a pioneering 180-credit, 4-year program blending theory,



Note on Developments since last meeting of Governing Body meeting held on 9th May,2025

Mr Nirmal Singh Rayat Chairman of RERT and Chancellor of LTSU briefed the members of the Governing Body about the developments that took place in recent months and are described as under:

- 1. The LTSU was established by RERT and had appointed Mr Sandeep Singh Kaura as the Chairman of the Trust and in that capacity he was given the charge of the Lamrin Tech Skills University as the Chancellor as per the clause of the Punjab Legislative Act No 22 of the 2021.
- 2. Prior to taking over as the Chancellor, Mr Kaura was working as MD of RB group of institutions run by RERT.I, the then Chairman of RERT had entrusted the task of preparing the project proposal for the establishing the Lamrin Tech Skills University and the Trust had empowered him to represent the trust in all the dealings with the State Government and also for presenting the case for establishment of the LTSU in the meetings held with the officials of the Government and other related statutory bodies. All the documents were prepared by Mr Sandeep Singh Kaura for submitting to the State Government. I am a UK citizen, blindly trusted Mr Kaura and accepted all actions in good faith that were needed in the process of formation of the LTSU.
- 3. Mr Sandeep Singh Kaura has misused his position as the Chancellor and has acted in breach of the good faith shown in him by me and RERT and also the against the provisions of the act. To mention few,

He retained drawing and disbursing(DD) financial powers with him without the consent of Governing Body and diverted funds of the university to his own account/his firms account to the tune of 13.46 crores.

Besides, he also misused funds to the tune of 36 crores during his tenure. The matter has already been brought to the knowledge of SSP Nawanshahr for investigation and appropriate action as per law of land. (Copy of complaint to police is attached.

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Mr Kaura paid salary to his wife amounting to 84 lakhs which is against the law. As per law relating to educational trusts, no member of the Trust can give salary to his family member. This also amounts to diversion of funds.

Mr Kaura appointed persons in various high positions without taking any prior consent from the Governing Body. Majority these appointments were against the financial discipline and the needs of the University. The procedure, that is required as per UGC, was also not followed for appointments of three PVC Pro Chancellor, Registrar and many others.

Mr Kaura initiated many such actions that were illegitimate and has pushed the LTSU to many legal litigations.

Instead of depositing statutory deductions in related to employees and salaries to employees, he diverted funds to his own account.

He purchased land in his own name by misleading the parties and using the funds of the university.

Mr Kaura entered into numerous MOU's with corporate sector and majority of these lapsed without any beginning as Mr Kaura failed to meet the commitments that he had promised while signing the MOU's

On getting the information of financial and administrative bungling ,RERT removed him from the position of the Chairman and appointed a committee to go into the details.

The Trust called a meeting on 22<sup>nd</sup> July to discuss and provide him the detail information about Bungling done by Mr Kaura .But he abstained and as such RERT removed him from the membership of RERT.

He filed a case in the honorable Punjab and Haryana High Court for seeking the stay on the proceedings of the RERT meeting but he could not get stay orders and the case is pending in the Honorable High court.

I assumed the charge as the Chancellor by the virtue of operation of the University Act.

I would further like to state that while acting in such a manner, I have done everything according to the Act of the University and with best interest of the University.

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A communication in this regard has already been sent to His Excellency, the Governor of Punjab who is also the Visitor of the University.

Mr Kaura tried his level best to destabilization the university by involving in various acts and allegations but in a way he was exposing himself as all those acts were his own deeds. The instability that has been caused by the action of Mr Kaura was short-lived and the campus has returned to normal working.

As the Chancellor of the University, it is my duty to inform the members of the GOVERNING BODY about all these events and seek direction from the members for the future course of action.
