Executive Summary

This report summarises all major academic, co-curricular, extracurricular, industry-collaboration and quality assurance activities carried out by Lamrin Tech Skills University (LTSU) during the academic years **2023–2024** and **2024–2025**, with analysis and recommendations from the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC).

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1. Introduction

Lamrin Tech Skills University (LTSU), Punjab, is **India's first industry-incubated, future-skills oriented university**, established under the **Punjab State Legislature** and recognised by the **University Grants Commission (UGC)**. The university has been set up with a mission to bridge the gap between **education and employability** through **skill-integrated, industry-aligned academic programmes**.

Strategically located near **Ropar (Rupnagar), Punjab**, LTSU brings together government vision, industry leadership, and global academic standards to empower students with practical skills, knowledge, and innovation capabilities required for the 21st-century workforce.

2. Institutional highlights

2023–2024 (selected highlights)

- Hosted **Yuva Kaushal Utsav (two-day)** — large skill festival with participation from multiple universities, ITIs and schools.
- Organized the **70th Senior National Women's Kabaddi Championship** (first time in Punjab), enhancing sports profile and community engagement.
- Multiple fresher and cultural events (e.g., Fresher's Party, Talent Hunts) across schools.
- Guest lectures, interview skills seminars and industry-awareness activities run by various constituent schools.

2024–2025 (selected highlights)

- **Fresher's Fiesta 2024** — “Abhyudaya: The Rise” for the 2024 batch (USCM).
- Celebration of **3rd Foundation Day** on 10 December 2024 with institutional ceremonies.
- Festival observances (Teej, Janmashtami, Teachers' Day) with active student participation and leadership presence.
- Expanded school-level events, industry collaborations and student orientation & onboarding programmes.
- **Jugaad Mela 3.0**, Date of event 30/09/25
- **Annual Athletic Meet** 20 November 2025
- Celebration of **4th Foundation Day** on 10 December 2025 with institutional ceremonies.

3. Academic quality initiatives

Curriculum & Boards of Studies

- Each School followed the university guidelines for Board of Studies composition (internal faculty + external academic and industry experts). Meetings were convened to revise syllabi where required and validate skill-integration across programmes.

Academic Calendar & Examinations

- Academic calendars for 2023–24 and 2024–25 were prepared and circulated; examinations and results were conducted as per notified schedules.

Faculty Development & Guest Lectures

- Multiple guest lectures (e.g., seminar on interview skills) and FDP activities were hosted to enhance employability-focused pedagogy.

4. Student-centric activities & student support

Orientation & Onboarding

- Multi-day student orientation programmes for incoming batches (August 2024 orientation for all schools) with sessions on registration, document verification, class in-charges and student support systems.

Co-curricular & Cultural Events

- Talent Hunts, Fresher's Fiesta (2024), Freshers' Parties (2023), Yuva Kaushal Utsav (2023) — these events are used by IQAC as indicators of student engagement and learning beyond the classroom.

Sports & National Events

- Hosting national-level tournaments (Kabaddi) and annual athletic meets contribute to student physical development and community outreach.

5. Research, extension & industry linkage

- Continued efforts to formalise industry tie-ups for internships and placements. The university continues to position itself as an industry-aligned skill-degree provider; IQAC recommends documenting MOUs, placement statistics, and industry feedback more systematically for future reports.

6. Governance, leadership & administrative improvements

- Regular meetings of statutory bodies, engagements with Chancellor and senior leadership on curricular and infrastructural plans

7. Admission Criteria

General Eligibility

- UG: **10+2 completion** (with minimum marks and qualifying subjects as per programme) with merit and/or entrance exam scores (e.g., JEE/CUET/IBM Entry).
- PG: **Bachelor's degree** with minimum qualifying percentage (e.g., 50% for MCA, MBA).
- Diploma: **10th or 12th pass** depending on programme.

Admission Process Features

- Online application through the official portal with submission of educational documents. itsu.ac.in
- Eligibility and merit review, possible interview stage for select programmes.
- Reserved category admissions follow government/UGC norms

8. IQAC analysis (SWOT)

Strengths - Active calendar of cultural, sports and skill-based events; good student participation.
- Clear industry-facing positioning and skill-first curriculum design.

Weaknesses - Placement and research metrics need consolidated reporting. - Centralised archival of MOUs, placement data and external examiner reports can be improved.

Opportunities - Leverage national events and festivals to raise institutional visibility and regional partnerships. - Build measurable KPIs for employability (internship-to-job conversions, skill certifications).

Threats - Competition from other skill-focused institutions in the region
